ICCA Argentina

Program Status – October 2012

The ICCA Argentina program has been under developing since late 2008, but it has had several problems along the last couple of years. Briefly, since a meeting that we put together with the Secretary of Agriculture in February 2011, there have been numerous obstacles and problems in the relationship with agronomists unions and universities. The main issue under discussion is that syndicated agronomists unions have complained about the "intromission of a north American organization" in the training of local agronomists. They were quite active and influenced universities making this a political point more than an issue on a certification program. Further, ICCA Argentina has been seen as an "intromission of a north America" by political groups.

We, as provisory ICCA Argentina committee, have worked talking and presenting ICCA to several institutions and organizations, such as the Secretary of University Politics of the Ministry of Education, several agronomist association, and universities at individual level and at their joint organization (AUDEAS, university association of deans of agronomy colleges). All these conversations greatly delayed and diluted our efforts on starting the program, even though the great support and collaboration from ASA, i.e. Luther Smith and Jim Vorst visited us on April 2011 and we greatly advanced in developing sections and evaluating local management of the program.

After several months of these lengthy conversations and meetings, we have decided to keep working in developing ICCA but with a lower profile. We are greatly supported by the Faculty of Agronomy of the National University of Mar del Plata (FCA-UNMdP), located at Balcarce (Buenos Aires), farmer's association such as AACREA and AAPRESID, associations of ag companies such as CIAFA, CASAFE, ACTA, and ASA and Fertilizar AC, and organizations such as IPNI. The Faculty of Agronomy of the University of Buenos Aires (FAUBA) is also actively collaborating in the program.
