

12% in jeopardy (682/5564)

51% dropped (348) [6.3%, 2.6%]

38% qualified leniency (254/659) (would have)

67% dropped (442) [6.9%, 3.3%]

## **Appeal Process**

- Appeals: 2014 68, 2015 98
- Policy Manual: <u>Extenuating circumstances</u>: e.g. loss of job, health condition, maternity leave, military service, changes of locale and position. The CCA needs to file the appeal (within the appropriate timeframe) in writing to the ICCA office, which will forward the written appeal to the local board. This consideration--<u>extenuating circumstances only</u>—could be repeated.
